# Over 50? Book your Free Flu and Covid Vaccinations Today

People aged 50 and over are now able to book their autumn booster and flu vaccines, as the NHS Covid-19 and flu programmes continue to protect the country ahead of winter.

Chief Medical Advisor at the UK Health Security Agency Dr Susan Hopkins said: "The double threat of widely circulating flu and Covid-19 this year is a real concern, so it's crucial that you take up the free flu vaccine as soon as possible if you are offered it. It will help protect you from severe flu this winter, and even save your life.

"All those over 50 are now eligible for the jab, many of which will have low natural immunity due to Covid-19 restrictions over the last two years".

# COVID-19 AUTUMN BOOSTER



You can make an appointment if you are

- 50 or over
- Pregnant
- Clinically vulnerable
- Health & Social Care worker
- Carer (paid or unpaid)



#### How to book your NHS Covid-19 Autumn Booster:

Appointments are available to people aged 50 and over, pregnant women, clinically vulnerable / immunosuppressed individuals, health and social care workers and paid and unpaid carers. Anyone who falls into these groups are able to book now **online** or by calling 119. Calls to 119 are **free** from mobiles and landlines. 119 provides support in 200 languages.

Please look out for older relatives, friends and neighbours who may need help and support to book their vaccination appointments.

## Reminder for People Working or Living with Individuals on the Learning Disability (LD) Register

All those working or living with individuals who are listed on the LD register, as well as frontline health and social care workers and paid and unpaid carers have a right to access the Covid-19 Autumn booster vaccination as a priority group.



Everyone on the doctors learning disability register will be invited to have their

coronavirus vaccination if they haven't already had it. NHS England » Improving health

Appointments can be made by calling 119 or booking online through the <u>National Booking Service</u>. The vaccine is **free** to those eligible and it's easy to book by selecting "Yes, I am a frontline social care worker". Those eligible just need to self-declare when booking their appointment and will not be required to bring along evidence to the appointment.

All eligible people are strongly encouraged to accept the vaccination that is offered as soon as they are able – it is important to be up to date with the booster and build up protection against severe illness before the winter.

People are also encouraged to get their flu jab and in some cases these may be offered at the same time as the covid vaccination.



Book An Appointment

During the October half-term (from 24th October) there will be dedicated Covid-19 children's vaccination clinics held across Somerset. These are by appointment only, but plenty of appointments are currently available. 1st and 2nd Covid-19 vaccinations are available for all children aged 5-17.

Some clinics are specifically for ages 5-11 and others are aged 12+. Full details and

# Booking an NHS Free Flu Vaccination



Those who are eligible for the NHS free flu jab can be vaccinated via their Community Pharmacy or GP Surgery.

Those that are eligible may have received a letter from their GP about getting the flu jab and should follow the instructions outlined on that letter.

If an individual has not yet heard from their GP surgery regarding the flu jab and they are eligible for a free flu jab, then please help them to book at a local pharmacy.
