## 140 Members to discuss the proposal for a Solar Farm at Mahe Farm

Cllrs Freeman and Borland attended the Public Consultation. A discussion took place about where the panels will be located, how visible they will be, access to the site and how the infrastructure will be handled. One of the reasons for choosing this location was the ease of connecting the site to the grid.

### 141 Report from the Joint Burial Committee

Regular walks take place within the cemetery with the Chairman, Vice-chairman, Crewkerne Town Clerk, contractors, and groundsmen to monitor the overall appearance and maintenance of the site. Clarification with regard to trees within the cemetery boundary have been clarified with the CLR builders, to ensure there should be no felling or damage to trees when building does finally commence. On Sunday September 10th there will be the Townsend Cemetery Open Day from 10am until 2pm. This event is a great opportunity for residents to look around the chapel and landscaped grounds or peruse the old registers to look for burials of long-lost relatives. Local Funeral Director, Tracey Warren of Stoodley and Son will give a talk in the chapel at noon, this will be followed by a guided tour of notable graves in the older part of the cemetery. The tour is always full of interesting information and historic facts.

Cllr Yeomans gave his resignation verbally to the Chairman. Asked if she required this in writing the Chairman responded in the affirmative. Cllr Yeomans then left the meeting.

### 142 Highways Matters

A large number taking place during school holidays when road usage is less that during term time.

### 143 Brief report from the recent LCN Meeting held in Donyatt

Councillor Freeman attended this enthusiastic and well attended meeting. He is willing to be West Crewkerne representative at future meetings. There are 34 parishes within the Crewkerne and Ilminster LCN. County Councillor Mike Best was elected Chair and stated that all parishes irrespective of their size would have just one vote. The aim was to have Community Issues resolved by consensus.

#### 144 Chairman to give a brief overview of the training attended on Recruiting and Retention of Councillors

This was an interesting course which gave insight into how any volunteer organisation should plan for the future. Simple guide is to ideally talk to locals in the community, and encourage them to come along to meetings, so they can see what, how and why 'things' happen. This is easier said than done, especially in a scattered rural parish as is West Crewkerne. Very few residents know each other and venture from their home surroundings. We should have a plan in place to bring along the next generation of councillors, so we can as and when we wish retire.
